Lieutenant Governor Little Welcomes Expansion of Plastic Plant to the Magic Valley Hilex Poly announces it will be expanding its Jerome facility

JEROME, Idaho – Lieutenant Governor Brad Little will participate in the expansion announcement of the Hilex Poly Facility in Jerome.

"Today's announcement is a continuation of great companies adding value to Idaho commodities while simultaneously creating good jobs for Idaho families," said Lt. Governor Little. "We want companies like Hilex Poly in our state."

Hilex Poly, now known as Novolex, produces plastic carry out bags in their Jerome, Idaho facility. The current site was built in 2004 and has 125 employees with an annual payroll of \$7.2 million dollars. This expansion will increase local tax revenue by providing local contractors with increased opportunities and by the end of April 2016 an increase in 45 jobs is expected. Novolex also produces paper bags, sandwich wraps and many other flexible packaging items.

"The Magic Valley has been the envy of other economic development agencies in other states, thanks to the dedicated work of Jan Rogers and the Southern Idaho Economic Development Organization. The Magic Valley, among other areas around Idaho, has proven to be the ideal location to build manufacturing facilities and we welcome those businesses," said Little.
