ESTIMATED COSTS

- Co-Exhibitor Registration Fee: \$1,500
 This fee is the responsibility of all participating companies to paid directly to the show organizer
- Estimated Travel Costs:
 - For a small company (per SBA guidelines) that applies for and receives a STEP grant: The company will receive a stipend award of

\$1,500 towards eligible expenses (reimbursed after the show), remaining costs are the responsibility of company

- Estimated budget:
 - Airfare: \$1,500
 - Lodging: \$2,125 (\$425/night x 6 based on Federal per diem, actual expense may vary +/-)
 - Ground transportation: \$200
 - Meals: \$1,098 (\$183/day x 6 based on Federal per diem, actual expense may vary +/-)
- Note: Shipping of samples and product displays, as well as extra print displays are the responsibility of the company
- For companies that do not qualify for the STEP grant: Responsibility of company
- Booth Space:
 - For a small company (per SBA guidelines) that applies for and receives a STEP grant: Booth space is included in STEP award (\$0 out of pocket for company)
 - For companies that do not qualify for the STEP grant: Booth space will be figured as cost share based upon square footage needed and payed directly to the show organizer

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

BUY AMERICAN - US CONTENT REQUIREMENT

The Small Business Administration (SBA) requires all awardees of the STEP Grant Program to self-certify that the company is an export ready U.S. company seeking to export goods or services of U.S. origin or have at least 51% U.S. content. All applicants will have to attest to this new rule on a self-representation form when applying for any STEP funded activity (see the Self-Representation as Eligible Small Business).

The U.S. content requirement is detailed in the Code of Federal Regulations (<u>48 CFR Part 25</u>). The SBA also intends to provide further guidance on how to officially determine eligibility. In the interim, we are providing the attached <u>Buy American - U.S. Content Calculation</u> for your convenience.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Applications will be competitively reviewed by a panel. We encourage diligent review of the <u>Guidelines for Trade Show Participation</u> as well as clear and thorough answers to application questions to remain competitive.

Applications are now being accepted online at Idaho Commerce's Grant Portal. Returning applicants can use existing login to access.
