



Viewing Solar Eclipse on IDL lands

Wildfire Awareness



The eclipse will occur during the height of fire season. Please take necessary precautions to ensure you do not start a wildfire.



- Ensure your safety chains are secured. Dragging and sparking chains are a frequent cause of wildfire along Idaho's highways

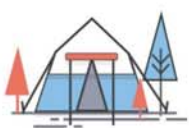

- Don't drive a vehicle over dry vegetation in the heat of summer and clear out vegetation underneath a vehicle when you park
- Carry a shovel and water container in your vehicle
- To report a Wildfire call **#FIRE**

Camping



Idaho Department of Lands (IDL) does not have campgrounds or facilities on endowment lands. **Dispersed camping (camping outside of a designated campground)** is allowed on IDL- managed lands, but it is limited to a **10-day** stay. Some sections of endowment lands may be closed temporarily for public safety reasons because of specific activity on the land.



- Obey signs and closed gates
- Fire restrictions are in place. Campfires are NOT allowed. Visit <http://www.idahofireinfo.com/p/fire-restrictions.html> or call **1-844-ID-FIRES**
- Camp at least 200 feet away from water sources
- Dispose of human waste properly (away from water and in a 6" or deeper hole)
- Keep a shovel and water container readily available
- Remove all trash and remember - pack it in, pack it out

Parking

Be aware of where you park to watch the eclipse. Do not block roads as it could prevent access for fire engines and other emergency responders.
