State Broadband Update

IIG/Iron project and Port of Lewiston project have both been signed and executed.

All 18 Capital Idaho projects have been executed.

Regarding BEAD, 2-24 will be spent implementing Volume 1 and Volume 2, opening the preview time, going through the challenge process, identifying project areas, pre-qualification, application process, and awards.

BEAD Regional Coordination and Planning Grant

IBAB set aside \$500,000 in grant funds to create subject matter experts, build broadband coalitions, and engage tribal and rural communities. This grant will open March 6th for 21 days with approval of IBAB. Would like to bring applications in front of IBAB early April. Each grant will have a maximum of \$50,000. ISPs cannot submit an application unilaterally but can act as a partnership.

The process was created in house based on direction of IBAB in summer of 2022. Draft was published on February 23, 2024. Communication plan includes meetings with all 44 counties and tapping other resources amongst partners. If the application turnout is low, a second round will open.

Been focused on the need and application of broadband action teams and the utilization of technical assistance. This panning grant will allow for these as well as creating subject matter experts.




Re: BEAD Regional Coordination and Planning Grant: Round One Summary

- » Applications were scored by two separate reviewers, using the NOFO and scoring matrix provided by Idaho Office of Broadband.
- » Reviewers convened, reviewed scores, and determined final ranking. Those highlighted had cost-share or a matching contribution identified.

Scoring matrix reallocation of points.

Per the BEAD Program NOFO, NTIA guidance documents and curing comments concerning:

Secondary criteria for Priority Broadband Projects (All Fiber), "Speed of Network and Other Technical Capabilities" <u>cannot</u> be used. It can only be used as secondary criteria for Other Last-Mile Broadband Deployment Projects (non-FTTH/hybrid).

Currently, the Network and Other Technical Capabilities criterion is scored/weighted at <u>5 points</u> and needs to be reallocated to one or more of the following criteria areas.

Secondary Criteria	Current Score/Weight
Speed to Deployment	Maximum 5 Points; Weight 5%
Open Access	Maximum 7.5 Points; Weight 7.5%
Local and Tribal Coordination	Maximum 5 Points; Weight 5%
Equitable Workforce Development and Job Quality	Maximum 2.5 Points; Weight 2.5%
